PARKING PASSES ARE HERE

Students driving to school will be required to purchase a Marquette Catholic Parking Pass. Cost will be \$10.00 per pass. At the time of purchase, students must show license and proof of insurance for copying by the office. All passes should be placed in the front windshield lower right hand corner. All cars should be registered by October 31st. All students will be required to park in the student parking lot west of the Scholl Center. This is a safety concern. Edline – Parents – are you able to view your student's grades?

The Quick Version

- Log in to Edline using your screen name and password
- Click the student name (upper left hand side under the heading "Shortcuts")
- Click "Private Reports" (left hand side a couple of lines under the student name)
- You will see a list of grade reports in reverse chronological order of when they were posted.
- Click View under the heading "Report". This is the actual grade report.
- When you are finished with viewing that report, click "Done" at the bottom. You will return to the list of grade reports to view the next one of your choice.

Please review your child's current academic progress at **Edline**. All student grades are posted by after school on Wednesdays. Please contact the teacher if you have questions regarding your child's progress. Remember, teachers are available before and after school by appointment. Lunch time provides opportunity for organized peer tutoring through our National Honors Society. There is always extra help, please seek it out if needed.
