Edline – Parents – are you able to view your student's grades?

The Quick Version

- Log in to Edline using your screen name and password
- Click the student name (upper left hand side under the heading "Shortcuts")
- Click "Private Reports" (left hand side a couple of lines under the student name)
- You will see a list of grade reports in reverse chronological order of when they were posted.
- Click View under the heading "Report". This is the actual grade report.
- When you are finished with viewing that report, click "Done" at the bottom. You will return to the list of grade reports to view the next one of your choice.

Please review your child's current academic progress at **Edline**. All student grades are posted by after school on Wednesdays. Please contact the teacher if you have questions regarding your child's progress. Remember, teachers are available before and after school by appointment. Lunch time provides opportunity for organized peer tutoring through our National Honors Society. There is always extra help, please seek it out if needed.

Junior Parents:

Marquette is scheduled to administer the PSAT/NMSQT on October 14, 2009, to all 10th and 11th graders. In the past, the State of Indiana has supported the program by covering the cost. However, this year, the state will provide funding for all Grade 10 students only. They have their reasons. While the Superintendent of Public Instruction and our Governor encourage Grade 11 students to take the PSAT, budget allocations permit state funding of the PSAT for one grade level only. Although scores from Grade 11 PSAT participation are the ones utilized in the National Merit Scholarship program and other merit-based scholarship programs, priority has been given to the Grade 10 participants. The cost of the exam is \$13.00 and we, unfortunately, have to pass that onto the student. Please send your payment of \$13.00 in to Mrs. Mark in the Office of Academic Affairs before October 14th.
